### **Forklift Training Tips**

The following checklist is important for whatever workplace that has lift trucks on the premises. Each of these questions should be answered with "yes" if all the safety rules and regulations are being followed. A "no" to any question indicates a procedural weakness which might cause damage to machine, accident or injury.

- 1) Is the operating area of the forklift separate from the traffic of pedestrians?
- 2) Is access to forklift areas by pedestrians restricted by a barrier?
- 3) Are pedestrian walkways well marked and provided?
- 4) A sign is clearly visible stating a "lift truck in operation"?
- 5) Are mirrors for pedestrians and drivers provided at blind spots?
- 6) Are alterations to daily forklift schedules communicated to all affected staff?
- 7) Are lift truck tires suitable for use on all operating surfaces?
- 8) Is the seatbelt being used?
- 9) The seat of the forklift is in good condition?
- 10) The maintenance schedule of the forklift is being followed?
- 11) Is an annual forklift certification and inspection done?
- 12) Is the kind of forklift appropriate for the tasks?
- 13) Is there a load chart that is readable on the forklift?
- 14) Do all operators understand how to read the load chart?
- 15) Does the chart list the safe capacity for various attachments and uses?
- 16) Do the forklift warning devices work right?
- 17) Is the operating speed control device fitted correctly?
- 18) The lift truck overhead cage is fitted properly?
- 19) Have all lift truck operators obtained certification?
- 20) Are warning signs and speed limits being observed?
- 21) The operators have current training for the lift trucks being utilized?
- 22) Do operators know their responsibilities to report any machine damage and forklift accidents?
- 23) Prior to the equipment being used, the pre-test checklist is being reviewed every day?
